## Upcoming MyGinnieMae Security Enhancements - October 2024

Ginnie Mae is excited to announce new enhancements to the MyGinnieMae (MGM) Portal. These enhancements improve overall user experience, reduce risk and security concerns, and position the MGM platform to be more agile and adaptable. The following enhancements are now live:

End-User Name Update	Organization Administrators will now be able to update End-User's First, Middle, and Last Names directly through the MGM Access Management Console.
Password Policy Update	The password policy requirements have been simplified. These requirements must be followed when updating or changing your MGM password in the future:  Password must not match or contain first or last name. Password must be 8-20 characters long. Password must contain at least 2 alphabetic characters, and at least 1 uppercase and lowercase letter(s). Password must contain at least 1 numeric character(s). Password must contain at least 1 special character(s). Password must not contain the username or match the last 24 previous
Email One-Time Password (OTP) for Password Change	During all password changes, the One-Time Password (OTP) authentication will only be allowed via email. The Oracle Mobile Authenticator OTP will no longer be available for this function.
New User Registration Invitation Update	When sending a registration invitation to a new user, Organization Administrators will now be able to select their approved Email Domains from a drop-down list in the form based on the organization selected during the registration invitation.
